Discharge to Assess (D2A) Based on 2020 national guidelines

Aims: To facilitate safe and timely discharge for patients.

To enable assessment and follow up in the

most appropriate environment for patients.

To provide patient centred care.

Pathway 0

Less complex discharge, no formal input from health or social care needed once home. Including patients who return home with no change in their care needs.

Pathway 1

Support to recover at home; able to return home with support from health and/or social care.


Pathway 2

Rehabilitation or short-term care in a 24-hour bed-based setting.

Pathway 3

Require ongoing 24-hour nursing care, often in a bedded setting. Long-term care is likely to be required for these individuals.
